



Anonymous Drug Analysis Program

A GUIDE FOR PARENTS OR GUARDIANS

If you discover your child has a substance you think is a drug, the Nassau County Police Department's Anonymous Drug Analysis Program can help you find out if your suspicions are correct and what your next step might be.

This program will test and identify the substance and provide anonymous advice and counsel from a member of the NCPD Narcotics / Vice Squad. The suspicious substance will be destroyed after analysis. No criminal charges may be instituted through this program. For more information on the Anonymous Drug Analysis Program, see below.

Submit the suspicious substance for analysis to the NCPD as follows:

You may bring the suspicious substance to your local police precinct stationhouse along with an envelope to seal the substance in.

- You will inform the police personnel at the police precinct stationhouse that you wish to submit potential drugs for testing in the "Anonymous Drug Analysis Program".
- You must seal the suspicious substance in your envelope in the presence of police personnel and write a code name or initials across the seal. No other identification is necessary. No name need be given as the code name or initials on the package will suffice for further communication with the Department.
- After ten days has passed, you may contact Narcotics / Vice Squad at 573-3400, Monday through Friday between the hours of 9 AM to 4 PM and provide your code name or initials that you gave at the stationhouse when you submitted the suspicious substance for testing in order to receive the results of the drug analysis.
